We desire to enlist the interest of all who read this, in the progress of our venture. We have reached the stage where we must make a more direct appeal to the generosity of our neighbours. In these days of spoon-feeding and slave-mindedness, when self-sacrifice and devotion to an ideal have fallen upon evil times, it has been a source of wonder to our friends that, without the uplift of an organisation, any individual or any small group should shoulder the task of defending the weak, of teaching them how to resist the crush of the iron heel. However, we made it clear in our No. 3 and No. 4 issues that we received no funds from any organisation whatsoever and that we had to live entirely on our public's support.
